History ~ In Flanders Fields

Lt. Colonel John McCrae was a medical doctor with the Army during WW1. After a battle in the Flanders region of western Belgium in May 1915, and after performing a burial service for a friend and fellow soldier, he noted how poppies quickly grew around the graves of those who died in this area. This inspired him to write this poem. The red poppy bloomed across some of the worst battle fields in the Flanders region of Belgium during WW1. Their brilliant red color had become an

appropriate symbol for the bloodshed in the war. The wearing of red poppies has become one of the world's most recognized memorial symbols for soldiers who have died in conflict

Memorial Day

Memorial Day is a holiday for remembering the people who died while serving in the country's armed forces. Memorial Day is not to be confused with Veteran's Day which celebrates the service of all the U.S. military veterans. The practice of decorating soldier's graves with flowers was a custom in the U.S. before and during the civil War, thus the name, "Decoration Day", which was first used in 1882. Memorial Day did not become the more common name until 1967. On Memorial Day, the flag of the United States is raised to the top of the staff and then lowered to half-staff, where it remains until noon. It is then raised for the remainder of the day. The half-staff position remembers the more than one million men and women who gave their lives in the service of their country. At noon, their memory is raised by the living, who resolve not to let their sacrifice be in vain, but to rise up and continue to fight for liberty and justice for all.
